## Primary Signal to Partner's Leads

The choices are: attitude, suit preference or count. Most people choose attitude and that is my favorite. Attitude means that the size of the card played tells partner if you like their lead or not. A small card says, "I have no help or interest in this suit." A high card says, "It is safe to continue. I should have a useful card or am able to trump the third round."

Partner leads Ace – the Queen – or a doubleton in a suit contract.

Partner leads King – the Ace or Jack

Partner leads Queen = the King or Ten

Just because attitude is your primary signal, doesn't mean suit preference can't be used in certain instances. Suit preference is when the size of the card you play tells partner what other suit you are interested in.

4 Spade contract:

### Dummy

S	A J x x
H	K Q x
D	x
C	J 9 x x

Ace of hearts led

When partner wins a trick but dummy can take the next trick, the size of the card you play tells partner what suit to lead next. The eight (or higher) of Hearts would ask for Diamonds, the higher ranking non-trump suit. A low card would ask for Clubs.

A medium card, perhaps unreadable, may be saying, "I have nothing, protect yourself."

Suit preference may also be used when you are leading a card for partner to trump. A high card says, "Return the higher ranking, non-trump suit." A low card says, "Lead back the lower ranking suit."

Naturally all of this should be discussed with partner so that you can successfully use both attitude and suit preference.

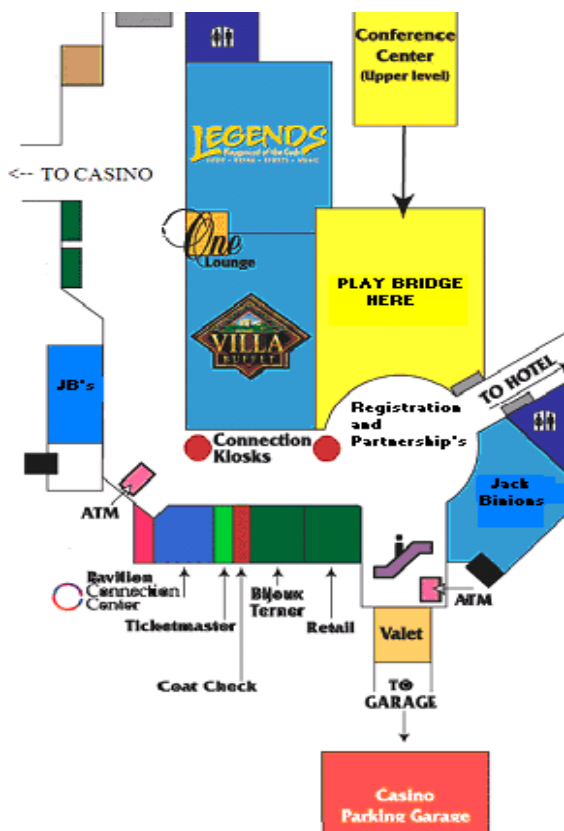
